STAT Emergency Medical Service and Fenton City entered into an agreement in January 2010 for the provisions of providing the City accountable EMS response times and reports. By doing so the community enjoys higher accountability and responsible service at no cost to the taxpayers of Fenton City.

Included in the packet you received contain CY2011 response times for your community. Response times are measured on a fractile basis to ensure accuracy and that any standard deviation to the required response time is followed up and reported. STAT's response begins upon receipt of the call from 911 until a STAT unit arrives on scene. (*see report graph's*)

Company Information Sheet

STAT Emergency Medical Services, Inc. was founded in 2000 in response to the concern that ambulance service in Genesee County was inadequate to meet the emergency and inter-facility needs of the community.

STAT EMS continues to grow its partnerships with private, Governmental and public organizations, including other EMS services, hospitals, fire/police departments and skilled nursing and rehab facilities. Such partnerships are a key ingredient towards providing both public safety and quality patient care to those in need.

STAT EMS is Nationally Accredited through the Commission on Accreditation of Ambulance Service or CAAS. Accreditation signifies that STAT EMS has met the "gold standard" determined by the ambulance industry to be essential in a modern emergency medical services provider. These standards often exceed those established by state or local regulation. The process included a comprehensive self-assessment and an independent outside review of STAT EMS. This independent process provides verification to the Genesee County Board of Commissioners, city council, township board members, medical community and others that quality care is provided to your community.

STAT EMS is contracted to provide EMS services to the cities of Linden and Fenton, Mt. Morris and Genesee Townships respectively. STAT is the only EMS service in the county to coordinate emergency responses with AVL and 800 MHz direct dispatching from Fenton 911 center.

STAT also provides, under contract, Genesee County Medical Scene Investigations and transports for the Genesee County Medical Examiner's Office of Dr. Hunter.

STAT EMS is a licensed Proprietary School with the Michigan Department of Energy, Labor & Economic Growth, and the State of Michigan Department of Education. STAT is affiliated with Hurley Medical Center with Dr. Mark Wilkerson, MD, DO, FACEP serving as their Medical Director for agency and all EMS education programs. STAT EMS Education employs 2 full time instructors and currently provides CPR/AED, Medical First Responder, EMT-Basic, and Paramedic courses.

STAT EMS expects to respond to more than 95,000 requests for services in 2012 and will exceed more than 2 million miles on their fleet.

With more than 230 ambulance personnel, support staff and 55 vehicles, STAT EMS is large enough to have extensive reach, yet small enough to still offer personal and customized medical care and services.

2011 EMS Response & Activity Report for Fenton City, Michigan

STAT Emergency Medical Service, Inc submits this annual report based on verified data by the oversight committee which included exception reporting on any and all calls where STAT did not meet the response time regardless of being in compliance. Response time reports and coordination are provided in on-going effort to improve the quality of care to the residents of Fenton City, MI.

Improving response times is one of several components of a good EMS system. Coordination, response time monitoring, quality, and community initiatives/education combined make up a healthy and vibrant EMS system to support the health and well being of its constituents and visitors.

STAT and Fenton City continued to build upon its relationship in CY2011 with continued partnering in areas such as EMS education, training, and overall responses with Fenton City Fire Department.

Fenton Fire and STAT EMS put together the first ever direct dispatch or (DD) in August 2010 in Genesee County. Since then the City and STAT have enjoyed a significant reduction in emergency life threatening response times for its residents and guests. (*See data chart*). Fenton City's EMS contract provides the level of coordination of service like non-other in all of Genesee County. Since the implementation of (DD), STAT has reduced overall response times in Fenton City by over 52 Unit Hours (UH). Response time comparison of EOY 2010 to EOY 2011 demonstrated response times improved by 25.5% for life threatening calls and 13.8% for non-life threatening calls. An overall 39.3% improvement in response times for Fenton City was achieved with this coordinated effort.

STAT began providing initial EMS Education in early 2011. EMT-Basic courses are held at the Fenton City Fire Department as a recognized State of Michigan Satellite pre-hospital EMS education facility. In addition, Fenton Fire Department joined with STAT's Continued Education Consortium where STAT was able to provide multiple continued education EMS classes for its firefighters at no cost to the fire department employee or city. Fenton Fire and STAT together provided trauma rescue training for its students and fire fighter's in CY2011 graduating over a dozen new people entering pre-hospital medicine.

In Summary, overall response times exceed in compliance the National average given the demographics of Fenton City and surrounding communities. STAT EMS recognizes there is a continued need for improvement and together we will continue to take the necessary steps to ensure the company remains fiscally and operationally sustainable in an environment that is rapidly changing. STAT is committed to serving the constituents and leadership of Fenton City in every capacity.

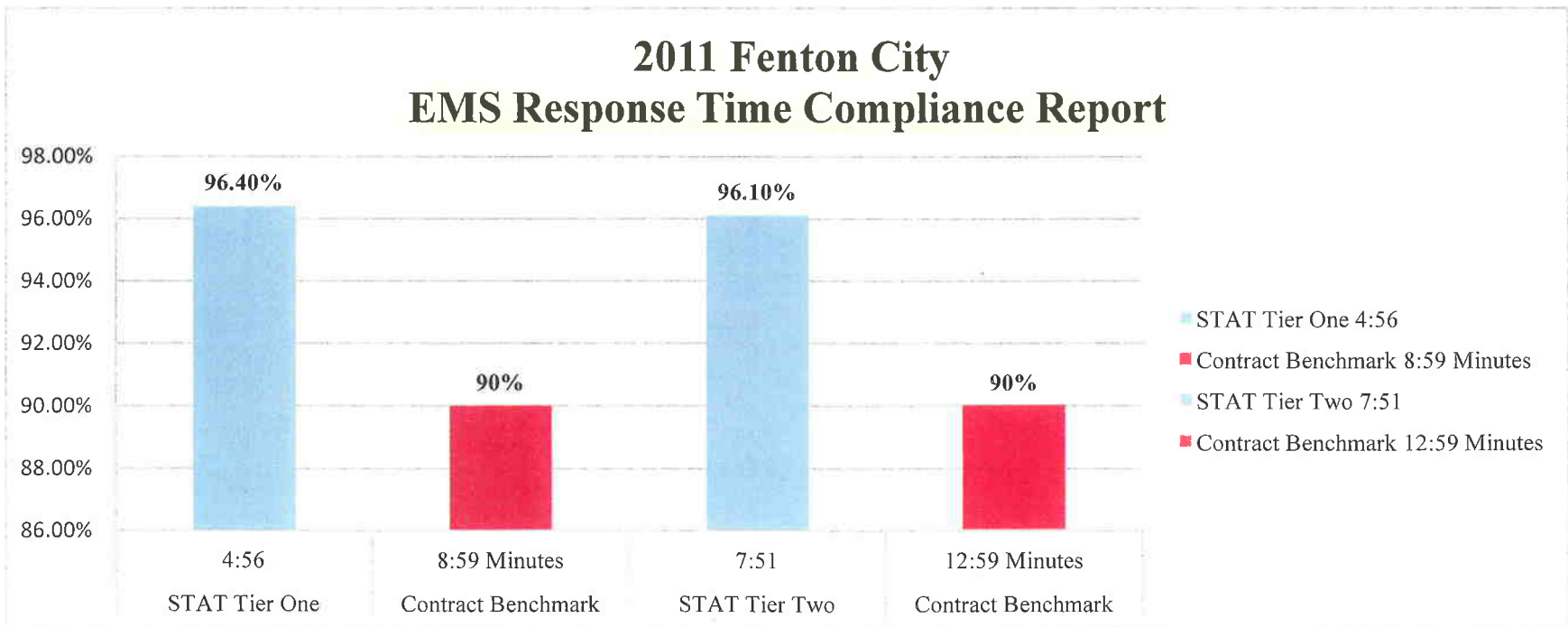
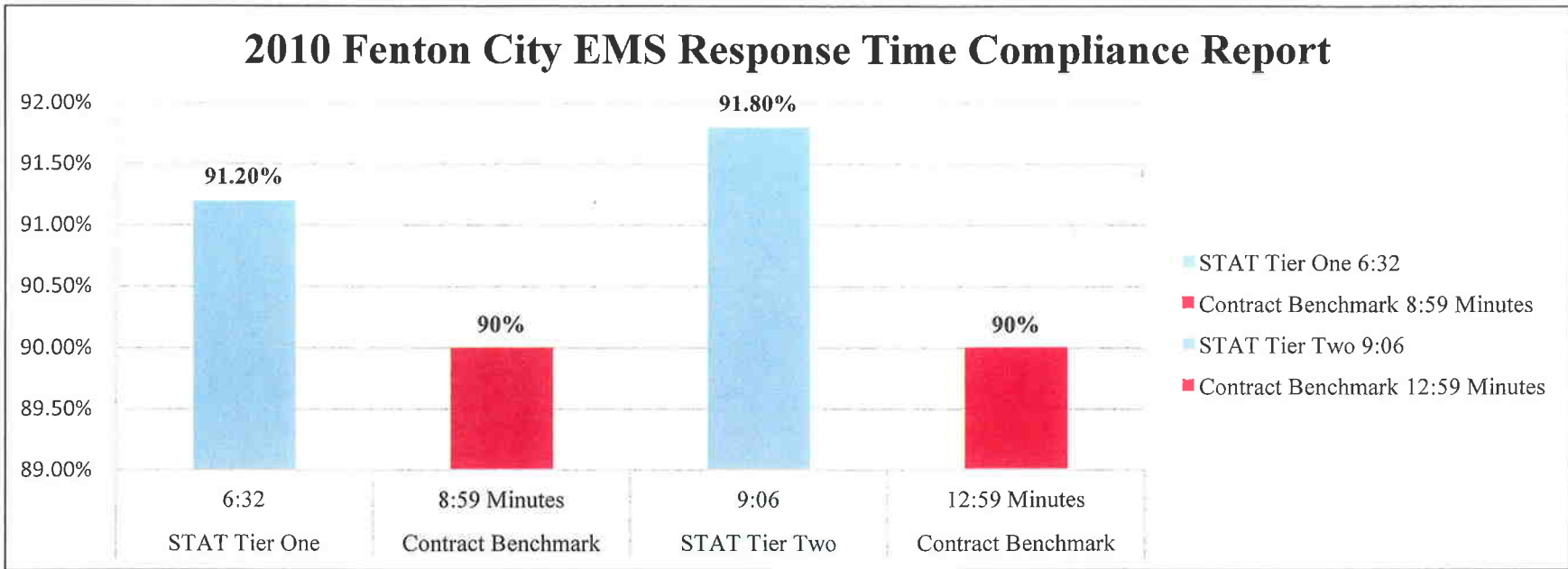

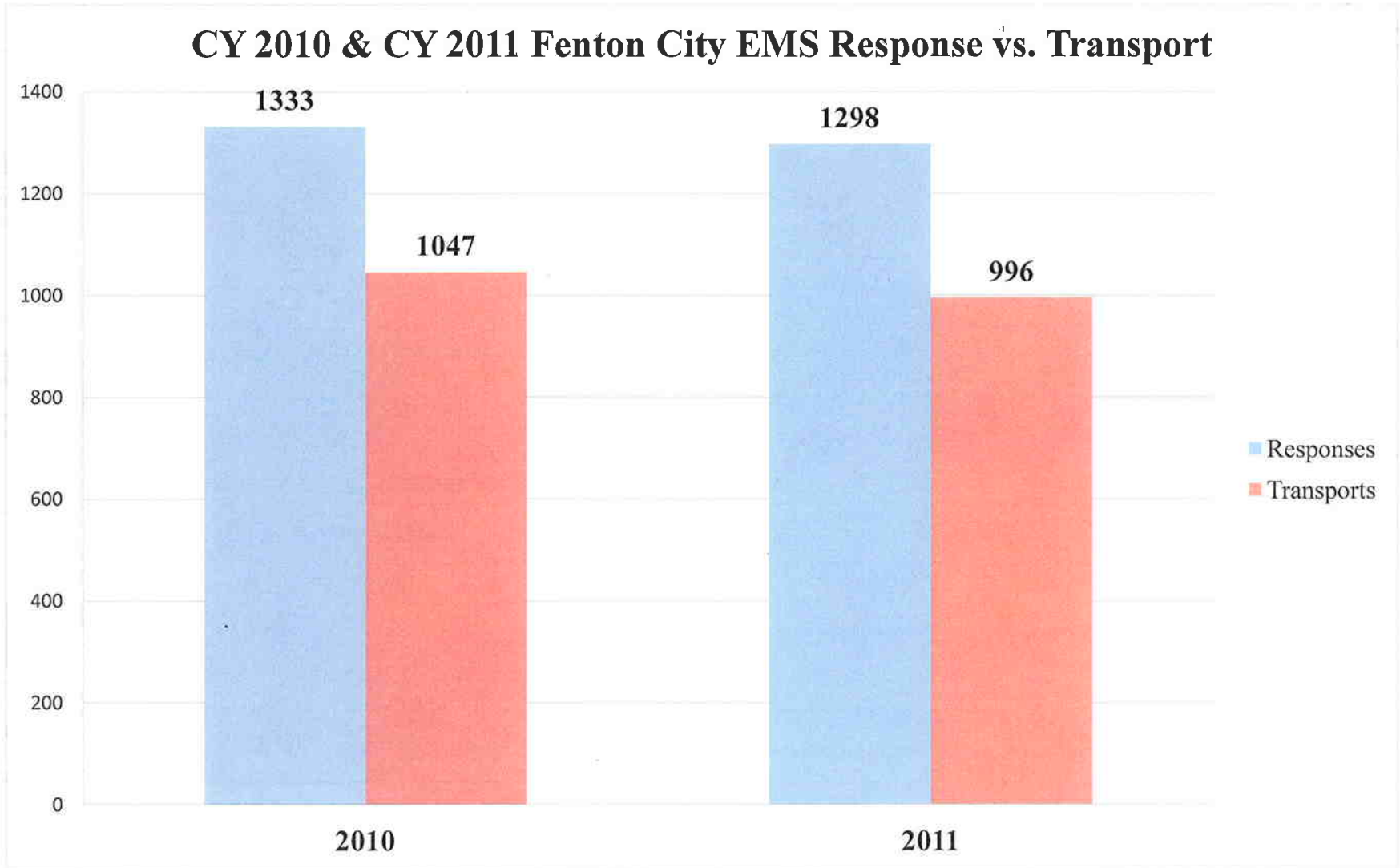

STAT Emergency Medical Service, Inc a Nationally Accredited ambulance service announces it is expanding its non-emergency transport wheelchair van and CAB service to Saginaw County, MI in late February.

CPR AND AED CLASSES EXPAND TO MORE DAYS IN GENESEE COUNTY

STAT EMS is now providing CPR and AED refresher courses to two sessions a month on the second and fourth Tuesday of every month from 9 a.m. to 1 p.m. The course is designed to teach the skills of CPR for vic-

tims of all ages including; ventilation with a barrier device, a bag-mask device and oxygen) use of an AED, and relief of FBAO. It is intended for participants who provide healthcare to patients in a wide variety of settings. This is an America Heart Association Course and is a two year certification.

SPRING EMT-BASIC CLASS ENROLLMENT NOW OPEN!

GASC TECHNOLOGY CENTER AND STAT EMERGENCY MEDICAL SERVICE ANNOUNCES PRE-HOSPITAL EMS EDUCATION PARTNERSHIP!

STAT Emergency Medical Service, Inc. headquartered in Genesee County announces a partnership with the GASC Technology Center (Skill Center) and Flint Community Schools to provide pathway of submission into an EMT-Basic and Paramedic School at STAT Emergency Medical Service, Inc. which can lead to potential employment in a field of pre-hospital medicine that is growing leaps and bounds not only in our local community but Nationwide.

This partnership is designed to provide, among other goals, a dual enrollment for students in the Emergency Medical Technician training program owned and managed by STAT Emergency Medical Service, Inc. This is an established partnership between the GASC Technology Center, a Career and Technical Educational Center, and STAT Emergency Medical Service, Inc. STAT is a licensed Proprietary School with the Michigan Department of Energy, Labor & Economic Growth, and the State of Michigan Department of Education.

Last year, STAT Emergency Medical Service offered more than 6,000 hours of training and helped lead many people to jobs, additional certifications, and promotions in the EMS industry.

STAT EMS began its pre-hospital EMS Education Department in late 2008 and has since added in addition, to its main campus, two satellite education facilities in Genesee County. Their main campus location is downtown Flint and the satellite locations are located in Fenton and Flushing City conveniently stationed at the local fire departments.

"Our goal is to provide access to EMS education and provide opportunities for individuals in our community desiring to become an EMT or Paramedic", says Joseph Karlichek, COO and Education Representative. "Our programs are designed to educate and train 21st century EMS responders. In doing so our students have the opportunity and the knowledge to save someone's life upon becoming licensed and obtain a rewarding career in pre-hospital medicine", Karlichek adds.

"We have successfully graduated over 100 students, and many of them are now either employed here at STAT or have sought nursing or firefighter careers", says Gary L. Denman, EMS Education Coordinator. STAT is in the top 10 of Paramedic schools in the State of Michigan with higher National Registry pass rates. National Registry is the testing body for anyone wishing to become licensed in the State of Michigan.

The education department is overseen by Medical Director Mark D. Wilkerson, MD, DO, FACEP Department of Emergency Medicine at Hurley Medical Center. Students receive and perform their clinical internships at Hurley's Level One Trauma Center and Regions leading Pediatric Trauma provider in Genesee County.

In addition to providing MFR, EMT, and Paramedic courses to people interested in the medical field, CPR education is available as well to first responders, nurses, firefighters, and police officers throughout Genesee County.
