IMPORTANT INFORMATION REGARDING SEWER WORK IN YOUR NEIGHBORHOOD

The City of Fenton has contracted with Pipeline Management Company to perform condition assessments of sanitary sewer and street storm drains throughout various locations in the city. The program is partially funded through a Michigan Department of Environmental Quality (MDEQ) Storm, Asset Management & Water (SAW) Grant. The City's engineering firm, OHM will be overseeing the project.

As part of this program, the contractor is scheduled to be cleaning and televising the sanitary sewer lines in the area of your property. **During the cleaning operation, we advise residents to keep toilet lids CLOSED as pressurized cleaning of the sewer main may result in water bubbling/gurgling in the toilet.** While it is anticipated that there will be minimal inconvenience during sewer cleaning and televising, residents may experience noise in the home drain pipes while the sewer main is being cleaned in the proximity of their sewer lead.

Most of the work will occur within the City right of way. In some cases, the contractor and OHM will need to access structures on your property to obtain access to the sewer or storm drain system. In that case, you will be notified in advance of property access. All workers assigned to the project will have photo ID identifying them as employees of Pipeline Management or OHM Engineering Advisors.

The Program begins in mid-November and is expected to be completed by April 2020. Work hours are Monday through Friday 7am to 6pm. Some Saturday work may be scheduled during daytime hours.
