

**CITY OF FENTON COUNCIL WORK SESSION PROCEEDINGS**

Mayor Osborn called the meeting to order at 7:30 PM.

**ROLL CALL**

**PUBLIC COMMENTS**

Damien Siwik requested to speak on the urgent boiler repair and LED light upgrades.

**URGENT BOILER REPAIR - WATER TREATMENT PLANT**

A motion was made by McDermott and supported by Bottecelli to approve the cost for urgent boiler replacement and repair of the second boiler at the Water Treatment Plant and award the project to K&S Ventures, Inc. for a cost of \$20,600.00.

**Motion carried by unanimous voice vote.**

**LOCAL STREET LIGHTS LED UPGRADES**

A motion was made by McDermott and supported by Jacob to approve the costs for new LED luminaries and replacement polycarbonate globes to update the streetlights in the Andover Woods subdivision and Waters Edge subdivision and approve the purchase of materials from City Electric Supply at a cost of \$8,669.76 and electrical services at a cost of \$6,600.00 from Carnes Electric.

**Motion carried by unanimous voice vote.**

**DISCUSSION ON LADDER TRUCK REPLACEMENT**

Chief Cairnduff presented information on a proposed purchase of a new ladder truck. Trucks purchased now would not be received for 2-3 years. The manufacturer is implementing a 5% increase on orders placed after March 1<sup>st</sup>. In addition to use in the city, a ladder truck is used for mutual aid to surrounding communities.

Grossmeyer reported early registration is open for April's CapCon.

Sage inquired about the Tavern's planned Tent Party.

Lockwood gave an update on the Veteran's Memorial Park committee and Arts & Culture Commission. March 10<sup>th</sup> will be Cabin Fever event.
